Taking this 80th anniversary as an opportunity, we will invite Dr Helen Pankhurst, a granddaughter of Sylvia Pankhurst who fought for British women's suffrage and a women's rights activist, and Ms Cathy Watson, a social community development specialist who worked in Africa, to discuss women's rights and welfare, with three experts from Japan covering historical, literary and political perspectives.
